



With the rise of experimentation in Bollywood and rock, we have recently witnessed a pioneering electronic music subculture via Pakistan. The story of electronic music made a definitive impact on Pakistan in the new millennium, just like it did in Germany in the 1970s; in the UK and US, and Japan in the 1980s.

Pakistani DJs and bands have come of age, delivering an overabundance of styles ranging from house, minimal, drum'n'bass, and breakbeats to underground urban audiences.
